## A Pastoral Letter for October

Dear Christian Friends at Emmanuel,

As the leaves begin to change their color and become beautiful hues of yellow, orange and red, we know the fall season is upon us. After a hot summer I look forward to the change of weather, the crisp fall air in the morning and the cool nights for sleeping. The change of season also keeps me sharp. I know I need to prepare my yard tools for the leaf raking and brush trimming. I know that I need to tune up my snow blower, change the oil and spark plug.

At Emmanuel the season is changing as well in our redevelopment as a congregation, from one that was stuck in the past over pastoral leadership and conflict to a congregation that is beginning to see some positive growth. Your Church Council and Transition Team is looking at potential ministry partners to better use our facilities for the community good. Transition Leadership is working on the "Ministry Site Profile", a document describing Emmanuel as a congregation and its purpose in the community. Once this "Ministry Profile" is completed in December and submitted to the Bishop, The Church Council will begin creation of a "Call Committee" to be interviewing potential pastoral candidates in the spring.

Of all the many positive changes at Emmanuel this season, the one I like the best is the formation of a new Confirmation Class with eleven young people enrolled for the first year class. The congregation's Blessing of the Confirmands on September 17<sup>th</sup> was a very encouraging change for our community. The sight of these young people in their crisp red and white acolyte gowns was like the changing of the leaves outside, a sign of a new season to come.

Please pray for your congregational leaders this October as they plan and make significant changes for Emmanuel's future.

Change is good and keeps us sharp and focused on our purpose and mission. Jesus commanded his disciples to "Go, make disciples, baptize and teach the faith."

We will be asking you to make a change to accomplish this mission. Please start thinking now, about who you know that needs a church home, about who you could introduce to Jesus at Emmanuel. 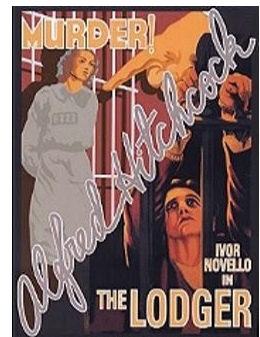

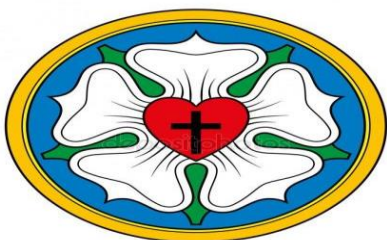
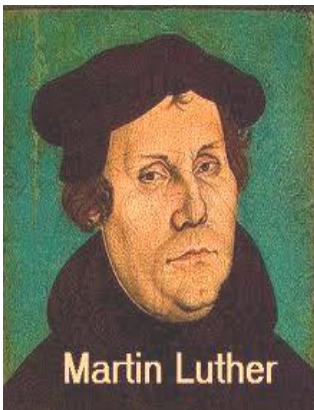
## **Rejoicing Spirits**

[Our music director, Steve Eisenhart, has expressed concern to me about the current state of our pipe organ. I have asked Pastor Miller to put into words the situation as he sees it. - Pastor Guiser]

It is now four months since many of you came together on a June Sunday morning to observe, with me, the fortieth anniversary of my coming to Emmanuel as your pastor. It was a memorable day for me. And I hope it was for you, too. During my twenty-two years as your shepherd, you and I shared so very much.

One of the high moments which remains uppermost in my memory is the day we re-dedicated our newly-rebuilt pipe organ. It marked the happy conclusion of a lengthy project which had begun nearly five years before. Robert Ahlum had chaired a committee whose members carefully considered all of the options open to us – scrap the old 1928 organ and start in fresh? purchase an electronic substitute? or, re-voice and add to the old? Ultimately, the committee recommended the third alternative. And, as I remember, the congregation approved it by a nearly 100% majority.

That was nearly 35 years ago. And since then, our organ has been used for hundreds and hundreds of worship services. It has pealed forth as young couples have pledged themselves to faithfulness in marriage. Its more somber tones have reflected the grief of families gathered to bid farewell to a deceased loved one. It is impossible to imagine our church without the music of our organ.

But time brings its changes. Many of the hidden components of our organ go back 90 years to when the M.P. Moller Company first installed it. Those parts – the wind chests, the ducts which carry the air to the pipes, the valves beneath each and every pipe (there are over 3000!) – are beginning to show their age. Some are failing. You hear that happening each time an intrusive pipe interrupts the service on a Sunday morning. Pipe organs do not wear out, but they do need the same kind of care that any intricate piece of equipment demands.

I have noticed this deterioration for more than a decade, each time I have played for a service. Steve struggles with it every Sunday. The organ may sound fine to you. But I need to tell you that it is now practically impossible to play any of the beautiful soft ranks of pipes. Both Steve, and any of us who substitute for him from time to time, find ourselves significantly challenged whenever we are up there at the console making music for your worship.

I fully realize the many issues which now confront us at Emmanuel Church. But, with Pastor Guiser's leadership, we are beginning to meet them – one at a time. The task I have set for myself here has simply been to let you know what's going on “up there where the music comes from.” And I would suggest that it is time to set in motion a plan to restore this fine instrument which would cost a half million dollars to replace. How this might be accomplished is something our church council will have to determine. But, whatever direction they may suggest, I hope that what I have written here will help you better to understand the need.

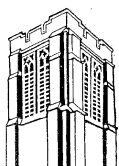

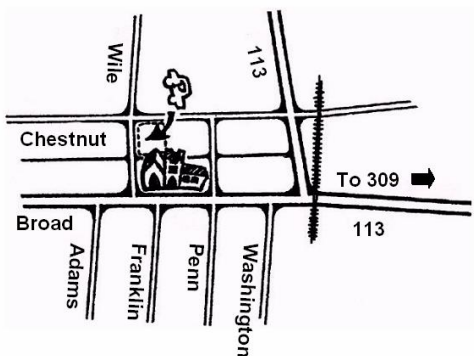
