

# Emmanuel Worships !

## *An Update from Pastor John*

Friends – June 4 remains the day on which the Governor’s current shelter-in-place order expires. However, the trend of new Covid-19 cases in our region does not indicate that we will move from red to yellow on June 4, and even soon thereafter.

I realize that is not good news for those of us who are eager to return to in-person worship, or to some of the church activities that have been suspended until they can be conducted safely.

Of course, even when our community is moved into the “Yellow Phase” of restrictions, there will still be limitations on gathering, and a continuation of social distancing protocols.

There are so many things to think about as we move toward a time when we can worship again in-person. The ELCA recently put out a guide to help churches get ready to do that. It is a long and extensive list of considerations focused on resuming worship and reducing the risk of exposure to the Coronavirus. Here is a link to access the document.

We are taking these matters very seriously and are aware of what has happened in some churches that have resumed gathering too soon, and without sufficient regard for safety.

To move us forward in planning and being ready when we are given the opportunity to worship again in-person, a task force has been formed to talk through the various issues involved, consider alternatives and contingencies, and lay out appropriate procedures for us to gather again. We’ll prayerfully consider things like the number of people that can gather, offering multiple services, having outdoor worship, communion practices, and more.

In addition to me, the members of the task force include Kathie Afflerbach David Blaich, Jennifer Casta, Carole Darragh, Michael Geiger and John Wellington.

As the committee begins to meet and move forward, I will let you know what we are planning. We hope to present a full plan to the Church Council by the end of June.

Meanwhile, for the remainder of May and June, here’s what you need to know and remember about church activities.

1. There will be no Emmanuel “office hours” until further notice. In case of emergency, please call Pastor John directly at **914-275-3106**.
2. We will continue worship Services by live streaming or recorded video on our website or Facebook Page, both of which are listed on the inside front cover of this bulletin. The Sunday Schedule will continue as follows:  
  
Sunday’s Kids Online @ 9:30 AM  
Sunday Worship @ 10AM  
Online Coffee Hour @ 11:30 AM
3. All normal church activities are suspended through the end of June. This includes the planned celebration of Pastor Emeritus Richard Miller’s 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ordinations. We are looking for an opportunity to reschedule the event, probably sometime in the Fall.
4. The E-Meal has flown past its 10000<sup>th</sup> meal on Saturday, May 16. More information may be found on page 10.
5. Thank you for keeping up your offerings. Electronic giving has more than doubled from pre-Covid tiems. If you haven’t enrolled, I invite you to do so by clicking the link on our website.
6. Join me each day at 8AM (Mon-Sat) on Facebook, for a morning “GodCast”, a 5-10 minute devotional where we gather for prayer, scripture reading and reflection on God’s Word.
7. It would be nice to check in each week. Please accept my invitation to participate in the Online Coffee Hour. Check your weekly email for access and join us at 11:30 AM on Sunday.



When I tell people that Emmanuel's E-Meal ministry has served over 10,000 meals in the last 2 months, people are impressed. When I tell them this ministry did not exist until March 16, 2020, the word most often said in response is "WOW"!
