Introduction to the Day

All the baptized have a calling in God's world. God calls not just pastors and deacons but also the youngest child, like Samuel. God calls those who doubt and are disillusioned about life, like Nathanael.

The story of the calling of Nathanael challenges our assumptions about prejudice. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth, a small remote town.

But where we come from isn't important; it's where—or rather whom—we come to. Jesus refers to Jacob, who had a vision in a place he called "the house of God, and . . . the gate of heaven" (Gen. 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

If you wish to receive gluten-free bread, please signal to the Pastor or Asst. Minister.

If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you may receive a blessing. As you approach, please place your hands across your chest in the form of the St. Andrew's cross. (X)

Come And See

Nathanael said to [Philip], "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." (John 1:46)

Much has been written and much more has been discussed about the condition of the church, especially in our home country. The facts are what they are, and from the perspective of the number of people affiliating with a church community, those facts show a sharp decline. In the last 25 years, more than 40 million people have left the church. That is a huge number of people who began the 21st century as part of a church community that today are no longer connected.

It's hard to pinpoint any singular reasons for this shift, though many have tried to assess some dominant causes. While there is some resentment and hurt directed at church communities that explains some of the decline, the general trends show church community as no longer being relevant to the lives of people we have traditionally welcomed into our ranks.

Knowing that gives us a bit of a silver lining inside the storm clouds. In general, people are not hostile toward church communities, and in fact, many still have a deep sense of faith that shapes their lives in some way. Some data surveys even suggest that people would resume affiliation if they found a church to which they could feel connected. Of course, that leads us to the question, how do we show them a church that welcomes them, nurtures them, and offers a sense of connection and wellbeing? How do we do this when people have already judged the church as no longer relevant.

There is one overwhelming cause for hope in all the data analysis being done – and it relates to why people come to church, and what might make them return or at least give it another try. By far, the largest reason people will attend a particular church is if they are invited by a friend or relative.

In other words, asking people to "Come and See" may be the single most effective strategy to helping people establish a connection to a faith community.

In this season of Epiphany, we are treated with several "Come and See" moments as we hear stories of how Jesus came to be known in the world. The star of Bethlehem invited the wise men to come and see. The wonder of Jesus' baptism was another "Come and See" moment for those that witnessed it. And this week, we are given one more "Come and See" story in a dialog between Nathanael and Philip, two men who would soon become one of the twelve disciples.

When Philip approaches Nathanael about his first meeting with Jesus, Nathanael asks a cynical question – one that exposed his own learned biases – "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" We might think that those who are not affiliated with the church might ask a similar question today, out of their own learned biases—"Can anything good come out of the church?" If we do face this type of question when we invite others to come to church, maybe the best response is to do as Philip did – just say "Come and See".

Now before we get too simplistic about this approach, we need to consider what it is that Philip was asking Nathanael to "Come and See". Philip's invitation was to come and see – Jesus.

Certainly, I encourage you to be liberal in inviting others to church. Some studies show that only 2% of church members will invite someone to church this year – just 2%. But the most important aspect of inviting others to church is what they will see when they come. Will they see Jesus?




