DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

All God's people are invited by our Lord, Jesus Christ to receive Holy Communion.

We receive these gifts of Christ's body and blood in faith, trusting that in this meal our Lord comes to us, forgives our sins, renews us in faith, and leads us into new life.

Lutherans hold to the understanding that Christ's Real Presence is there with the bread and the gathered community of saints.

When the ministers are standing at the front of the aisles, please approach, starting with the first row and using the middle aisle.

Please proceed to the Pastor or Assisting Minister where a communion wafer will be placed in your cupped hand.

All wine or grape juice is in individual cups, with signs next to each respective tray. After receiving the bread, please take a cup of wine or grape juice to drink. As you return to your seat via the side aisles, please deposit the used communion cup in the designated container.

If you wish to receive gluten-free bread, please signal to the Pastor or Asst. Minister.

If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you may receive a blessing. As you approach, please place your hands across your chest in the form of the St. Andrew's cross. (X)

There Is Only Us!

I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So, there will be one flock, one shepherd.

(John 10:16)

This fourth Sunday of Easter is always set apart for us as "Good Shepherd Sunday". Each year we reflect on the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd with the gospel reading from John 10. This way of thinking of the shepherd-leader goes back thousands of years into faith history back to Moses, King David, and the ancient prophecies that a shepherd-leader would come once again to lead the people. For us that prophecy takes shape in Jesus, our Good Shepherd, our Shepherd-King.

Seeing Jesus in this way reminds us that our leader will not rule by force, by coercion, by domination or by violent intimidation. Jesus' leadership is never self-serving. It is always life-giving.

As a shepherd-leader, Jesus guides us with love and grace, with a firm hand at times, but always with our best interests in mind. As we read the 23rd Psalm, we can be confident that Jesus is the one who leads us beside still waters and restores our souls. It is the voice of Jesus that leads us out of the valley of the shadow of death to bring us to the sources of abundant life that only Jesus knows. The sole purpose of Jesus as our Good Shepherd is summed up in his words "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly".

The image of the Good Shepherd is a source of comfort and encouragement for us, but it is also so much more than that. Seeing Jesus as our Good Shepherd should also remind us of the unity in which we stand with Jesus as our shepherd-leader. This is a unity which is unbound by any human barriers or rules. Jesus desires that all belong to his flock and that all may hear his voice. We are therefore one flock with one shepherd.

These words challenge our human desire to create rules for who belongs and who does not. And this is very true for our churches and our tendency to see those inside the church as belonging ("us") and those outside the church as not ("them"). Jesus, the Good Shepherd calls us to see the world as a much larger place than we can imagine. Because God so loved the world – the whole world – We are called to see all other people as "us". In the church, there is no "them" – there is only "us".

Churches have for decades focused attention on membership as the metric for success. A growing membership has been a visible indication that more and more people are joining the community of those who follow Jesus – our Good Shepherd. This is not a bad thing, but it tends to create barriers between who is "us" and who is "them". In its worst forms, the focus on membership creates points of judgment, resentment, and stinginess. Churches then wrestle with the question of who the ministry is for and who it should serve – the "us" or the "them".

If we listen – really listen - to the voice of Jesus, you can hear that Jesus does not call us to see the world in this way – to make judgements about "us" and "them". Jesus' desire is that we all be one flock with one shepherd who leads us to green pastures with the promise of abundant life ahead.

At Emmanuel, I am so encouraged that we have listened to the Good Shepherd's voice and have offered love and generosity to so many people in our community – expanding the definition of "us" in the spirit of Jesus' desire that we be one flock. We have done this without undue attention to adding members and increasing worship attendance. It's not that these things are unimportant, but quantitative growth comes out of a community that values discipleship, engagement and mission and commits to follow the voice of the Good Shepherd for the long run.

The name of our church, Emmanuel, means "God With Us." That name is a billboard to the community that we witness the God who is present with all of "us" in the world, Jesus - the Good Shepherd whose voice calls us to be one flock with one shepherd, and the Holy Spirit that sustains our work in the world to bring everyone together as one blessed "us".

Blessed "Good Shepherd" Sunday to all, and listen to Jesus voice – the voice of abundant life for all.






